ITEM 7C. Adoption of Resolution Adopting the San Luis Obispo County Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan

Recommendation:

Adopt the resolution adopting the San Luis Obispo County Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan.

Discussion:

The Federal Emergency Manager Agency (“FEMA”) requires agencies adopt a Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan (“MJHMP”) as a condition to receive funding for projects under pre and post disaster mitigation grant programs. The MJHMP is required to be reviewed and updated every five years.

San Luis Obispo County (“County”) is the lead agency for the regional plan and recently produced the five (5) year plan update. Other participating jurisdictions include the incorporated cities, special districts and community services districts throughout the county. District staff participated in updating the plan in 2025. The State Office of Emergency Services and FEMA have reviewed and approved the plan update, and the County Board of Supervisors formally adopted the plan on January 27, 2026. As a participating jurisdiction, the District now needs to adopt the updated plan to maintain eligibility to apply for hazard mitigation grants.

**A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE SAN SIMEON
COMMUNITY SERVICES DISTRICT ADOPTING THE SAN LUIS OBISPO COUNTY
MULTI-JURISDICTIONAL HAZARD MITIGATION PLAN**

WHEREAS, the County of San Luis Obispo (“County”) was the lead agency in the preparation of a Hazard Mitigation Plan involving multiple agencies and jurisdictions in accordance with State and Federal requirements; and

WHEREAS, the San Simeon Community Services District (“District”) recognizes the potential risk of harm to life and property to identify goals, objectives, and mitigation actions to reduce the potential harm these risks pose to life and property within the District and surrounding community; and

WHEREAS, Hazard Mitigation Grants and disaster relief funds administered by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (“FEMA”) require local jurisdictions to have an adopted and FEMA- approved Local Hazard Mitigation Plan (“LHMP”) or Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan (“MJHMP”), pursuant to the Federal Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000 as set forth in Title 44, Section 201.6 of the Code of Federal Regulations; and

WHEREAS, the District has provided input and was involved in the preparation of those sections of the Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan that pertain to the District; and

WHEREAS, on December 29, 2025, the County received notice from FEMA that the San Luis Obispo Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan had been reviewed and was determined to be approvable pending adoption by the local agencies; and

WHEREAS, adoption by the District and the other participating agencies will allow the Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan to receive final approval from FEMA.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Directors of the San Simeon Community Services District as follows:

1. The San Luis Obispo Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan 2025-2030 is hereby adopted.
2. The San Luis Obispo Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan 2025-2030 shall be updated every five (5) years in accordance with State and Federal requirements; and

3. The San Luis Obispo Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan 2025-2030 will be used by the District Board of Directors to reduce identified hazards that are within the authority of the District.
